What is a NAP?

A Naloxone Access Point (NAP) is a public place where anyone can get free naloxone—the life-saving medication that reverses an opioid overdose. NAPs are located all over the state of Minnesota, and provide free overdose prevention resources to the community, no questions asked.

- 📍 NAPs improve regional naloxone accessibility.
- 📍 NAPs reduce stigma through public identification to normalize naloxone as a public health resource.
